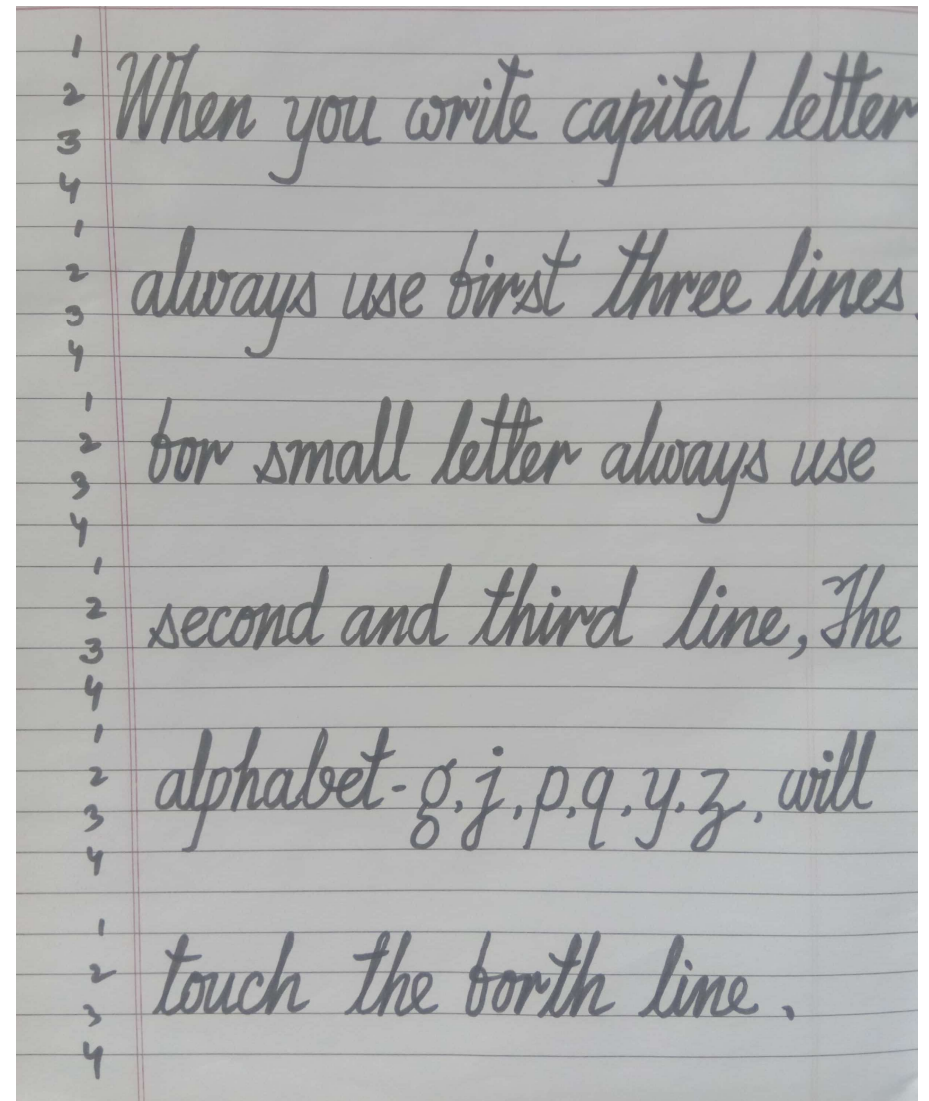
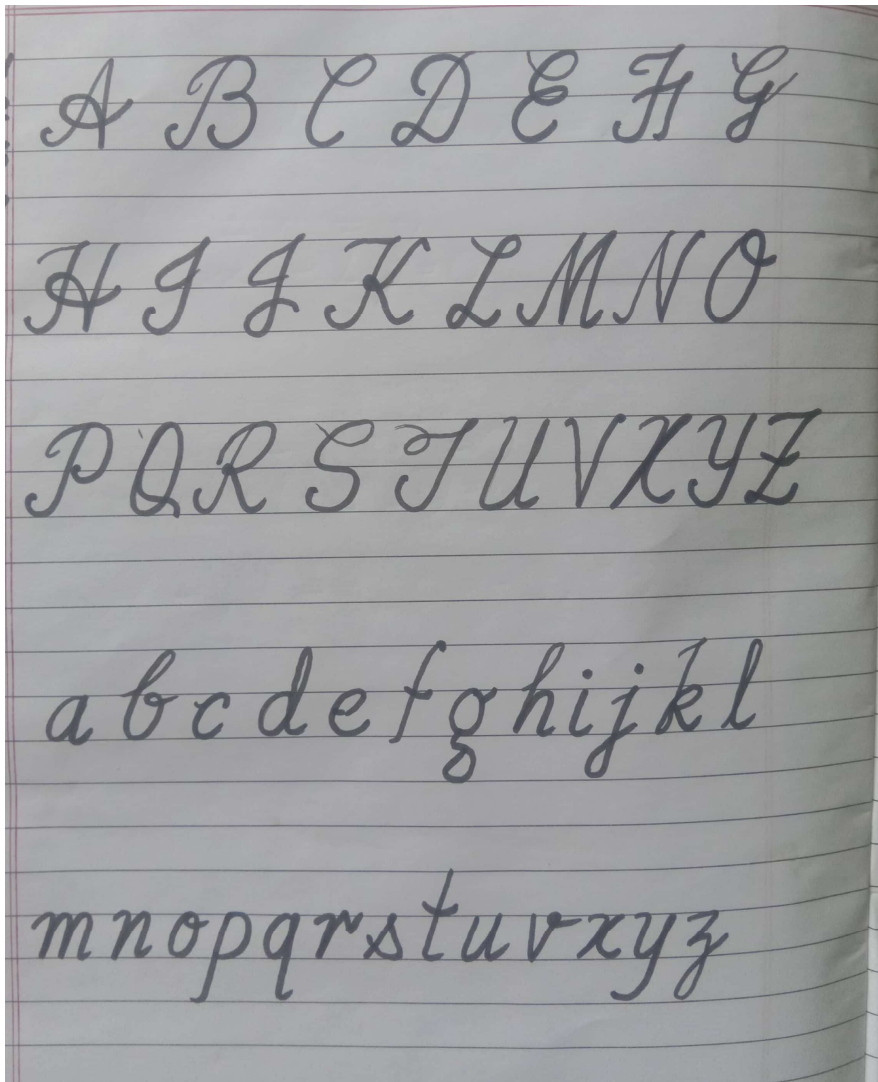

Topic - Safety

Precautions while working on electrical system =

1. In the case of an electric shock, when a person is still in contact with a live conductor, which you cannot switch off immediately, insulate yourself on a dry wood or thick paper or dry mat before attempting to get him clear, even do not touch his body, pull his clothes if they are dry or push him clear with a piece of dry wood.

2. Before switching on a current to any portable equipment make sure that it is correctly earthed and the cable insulation is sound.

3. Never disconnect a plug point by pulling a flexible cable.

4. Before handling a portable electrical equipment, be sure that it is disconnected from the supply and your hands should be dry. Switching off may always be not enough, leaking insulation may give you a serious shock.

5. In the case of electric fire, disconnect the supply immediately and do not throw water on live equipment.

6. Electrical fires can be put out by using the following types of fire extinguishers —

- (i) Carbon dioxide.
- (ii) Vaporising liquid
- (iii) Dry Chemical.

6. Do not open or close a main switch without permission from your authority.

7. Report the authority immediately in case of any defective line equipment, broken cords or plugs.

8. If there is any doubt about any connection, call the authority for advice.

9. In case of electric shock when breathing stops, artificial respiration must be started immediately. Send for a doctor as soon as possible.
